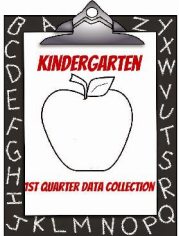
Breakfast Program – The St. Patrick School Food Service provides a nutritious breakfast and morning care daily for \$3.00.
